


## From the General Manager

### **From the Superintendent**

Hello from the maintenance facility. What a relief...the greens aerification process is basically complete. We are in the "healing up" mode now, which is a challenge due to dealing with sand that is debilitating our greens mower reels. Thanks to Dave and Tyler for overhauling reels each day after they are done being "trashed" by sand. The actual two days of aerification is a miserable process. I'm not a fan of the disruption that aerification causes, but it's necessary for healthy greens. The week after aerification is somewhat of a pampering episode. The greens don't enjoy having sand drug around on them on 80-degree days. We spend most of that week tending to any "fragile" spots on the greens. Our main goal is to get the greens healed up as fast as possible.

As the years go by, we are seeing more and more golfers out early ahead of the first tee time. Our goal is to perform our maintenance tasks in such a fashion that we stay ahead of the golfers starting on the first tee with the first tee time. This way we do not bother the golfers and we can perform our tasks much quicker. My concern is that an increasing number of members are coming out before sunrise and choose which 9 holes they are going to play that day. The maintenance staff then spends the first couple of hours dodging golfers on both sides of the golf course. The "early birds" we can deal with...but I need to steer them all to one starting hole. One 9 will now be closed daily until the first golfer makes the turn from the starting hole which will be hole # 1 or hole # 10. This is so we can prepare the golf course for daily play without any interruptions. Club management will have further discussions with the Board of Directors to come up with a policy that works for everyone.

The greens are healing up as quickly as possible. I know that it's frustrating to miss a short putt due to aerified greens, but please don't take it out on the grass. Unfortunately, we've found multiple divots on greens since aerification. It's dis-heartening for the maintenance staff and members to see damaged turf caused by a temper tantrum. This is your golf course, so please do your part to make it the best it can be by fixing ball marks, divots and not damaging greens. Thanks!

Good playing conditions should exist through the end of our golf season. September and October have always been my favorite months of the year at Valley View.
