I wandered out to #10 green today in order to inspect any ice layer that may have developed. We're looking good...other than the 15-16 inches of snow blanketing the golf course. As far as any ice layer, the only issue I saw was the annual winter deer trail that cuts through the middle of 10/12 green. Some of you have probably noticed these areas that struggle for a few weeks once the ice melts away. The green-up in these areas is delayed where these animal trails have created a thick build-up of ice. Last year we dealt with a few of these "trail areas" such as the approach in front of #9 green and the trail leading across #7 fairway to the nearby houses. These areas eventually return to healthy turf but are somewhat unsightly for a few weeks. I wish I could control the animals around here a little bit better!!!

Please remember that once most of the snow leaves the golf course...the maintenance staff still needs some time to get the course playable. I know golfers get anxious, but we always have a big mess to cleanup before we can open the course up for play.

# From the Professional

I'll be glad when February is over as it has become my least favorite time of year. All those nice days in January once again got my hopes up for an early golf season. On the other hand, I'm always amazed how fast the snow can melt given the right conditions. Let's keep our fingers crossed and hope for the best. Remember- golf injuries are quite common this time of year and most could have been avoided. Simple stretching and aerobic exercise will go a long ways towards making your golf game more enjoyable. Hit the gym, blow the dust off the golf clubs and get ready for a wonderful golf season.

I'd like to welcome all new members to Valley View Golf Club. Please stop in and introduce yourself as we would like to get to know all the new members. If you have any questions about VVGC rules, regulations or whatever we would be glad to help answer them for you. Also- we would appreciate it if every member would obtain a VVGC bag tag. Golf bags are often left outside and we would like to know who they belong to. Bag tags are available for you at the Pro Shop. Thank You!

The biggest change in golf for 2020 will be the merging of all handicap systems into the World Handicap System (WHS). Players around the world will have an apples-apples handicap index. Most golfers at VVGC should see a handicap change of less than one stroke. The end result is that handicaps will go down faster and slower to rise. The main changes are:

- 1. Net double bogey will replace the equitable stroke control. (ESC). The maximum hole score for posting will be limited to a net double bogey. The calculation is simple: Par +2 + any handicap strokes you receive on that hole
- 2. Your handicap index will be revised daily instead of twice a month
- 3. The new system will limit extreme upward movements of handicaps, will automatically reduce a handicap when an exceptional score of at least 7 strokes better is posted, and adjustments will be made for abnormal course or weather conditions exist.
- 4. A minimum of 3-18 hole scores are needed for a handicap.
- 5. Handicaps are based on the best 8 of 20 scores posted.

It's going to be a tough year to decide on equipment as all the major player have introduced new products this spring. The main equipment lines for this year will be Ping, Callaway and Titleist. Demo clubs will be available for you to try out in all the brands we carry. Apparel and shoes by Footjoy, Sun Mountain Sports, Sketchers, Straight Down, Adidas and Level wear will be offered this year.

Valley View members receive a 5% pro shop credit on merchandise purchases over \$100 (custom golf balls and Xmas sale items excluded). The merchandise credit will be issued to your account for you to use at your convenience before October 21, 2020. This applies to your guest purchases as well but the credit will be issued under the members account. This is our way of saying thanks for supporting your Pro Shop!

**APRIL CLUB REGRIP SPECIAL:** Did you know that slick; worn out grips make you grip the club tighter for control. The increased grip pressure creates tension in the forearms whereby restricting a proper release of the club through impact. Properly fitting grips are one of the most important and overlooked component of club fitting. If you are serious about your game you should replace your grips every season. Do yourself a favor and replace those worn out and slick grips!
