Happy New Year! 2020 was quite a different and difficult year for all of us. In our lifetime none of us could imagine having a Pandemic disrupt our daily routines and result in tragedy. There have been thousands who have suffered and perished due to Covid-19. Valley View has also had some members perish in 2020, our deepest sympathy goes out to all of you who have suffered the loss of loved ones. The Valley View Staff is looking forward to a much more enjoyable 2021 golf season. Winter has been relatively mild compared to recent years; it could be an indicator that our 2021 golf season may get off to an early start. In the last 12 seasons our earliest opening day was March 12, and our latest opening day was May 5th 2 seasons ago. The average season opening day is usually anytime in mid-April. Our staff will have the golf course ready for play in 2021 as soon as the weather provides us some adequate preparation time.

2021 Annual Dues & Guest Pass Program

The annual dues and guest pass program are extremely popular, your club has 525 memberships and there are 425 members who pay annual dues. The purpose of the annual dues program is to provide cash flow for the club in the early stages of each fiscal year and to provide 8 complementary guest passes for members who pay annual dues with cash or a check. To avoid incurring thousands of dollars in credit card processing fees the annual dues and guest pass program is now cash or checks only. Annual dues payments must be received by February 15, 2021. You will receive 8 guest passes for the 2021 season if you pay annual dues with cash or a check. The annual dues amount is <u>\$2.040.00</u>. Members may continue to pay annual dues with a credit card; however, you will not receive any guest passes. <u>If you are going to pay annual dues with cash or a check the payment is due no later than February 15, 2021.</u>

The Board of Directors has three Director positions vacant in 2021. These are three-year terms which will be served by the elected members. The terms will commence on February 9th, 2021. If you are interested in running for one of the three vacancies, feel free to contact a nominating committee member listed below to inform them of your interest in becoming a board member. The nominating committee members are Dan Roth, Ron Hecht, Lindsey Hurlburt, Ralph Lindahl & Walt Mosby. All interested members must fill out a candidate questionnaire. You may contact the business office to obtain a candidate questionnaire. You must submit your candidate questionnaire no later than Friday January 22^{nd,} 2021.

The restaurant did make a small profit during the 2020 golf season, this was a result of lower food costs and labor costs. As soon as restriction guidelines improve, we plan on opening the restaurant for indoor dinning. Currently there is not a specific date for Valley View to open for indoor dining. Valley View's primary concern is the safety of our members and staff, we will not make any decisions that will compromise your safety. Thank you for understanding as we experience these difficult circumstances.
