Ok...maybe we are a LITTLE behind schedule. Although...I did come across some of those great "memory photos" that google throws at you every now and then, and we are not as far from "normal" as one would think. The photos of Valley View in April 2014 and 2019 seemed rather similar to current conditions out on the course. Currently we might have an extra 10-12 inches of snow compared to previous years, but it sounds as though warm temperatures are only days away!

We did manage to have some willow damage removed a couple of weeks ago. Safety is the top priority when major tree damage is assessed on the golf course. Most of you have witnessed how much willow debris can fall to the ground during a storm. Some of this damage can include exceptionally large limbs. We will do our best to maintain beautiful trees out on the golf course, but sometimes Mother Nature has the last say in what we must do to provide a safe environment for the membership. There is still much tree maintenance to perform out on the course, but unfortunately our window to get a large bucket truck out on the golf course is shrinking. So much time and money are spent when the tree service must climb the trees to perform trimming. Ideally a bucket truck is the most efficient way to perform these duties, but heavy equipment and golf course terrain do not always agree with each other.

The next few weeks are going to be filled with anxiety for this old Superintendent. Soon we will get to see the effects that winter had on Valley View Golf Course. The fungicides that we apply in the fall to help prevent snow mold damage start to lose their effectiveness after a lengthy period under the snow. We are getting to the end of our comfort zone hoping for complete effectiveness, so you are not alone in hoping for some warm temperatures. Another concern will be how much damage the voles created this past winter. While blowing trails through the snow for the tree trimming truck, I noticed a fair amount of vole activity. Time will tell just how many of these little creatures were out traveling around the golf course this past winter.

Let us all pray for warm temperatures, but keep in mind, we would like to keep all this melting snow within the banks of our rivers, streams, and our very own Nash Spring creek! Moderation...the key word is moderation!
