I am totally amazed with the fact that August is here!!! I know that here is no way to slow down time...but my mind needs to get facts in order because it feels like June! The only factor that does a reality check for me is the hot, dry weather patterns that are typical of July and August. That situation has made its mark on the state of MT. Maybe not like a substantial portion of the United States, but we are dealing with warm and dry conditions here in our beautiful state.

Right now, the maintenance schedule here at Valley View is somewhat status quo. Mow, clean up willow mess, repair irrigation issues...and adjust the amount of water that is being run through the irrigation system. There is not a day that goes by that we are not turning irrigation up or turning irrigation down. Depending on whether Mother Nature gives us one of those surprise rainstorms, it is generally a daily adjustment to certain areas here or there. If Mother Nature gives us a supplemental rain shower, we might be able to shut the entire irrigation system down for the night. This is always welcome so that we may get the irrigation pond on #5 back up to "full" status.

My thoughts of ideal golf course conditions have changed over the last 20 years. Up until the last few years I have always wanted my golf course GREEN...wall to wall GREEN! These last few years with all the talk of water conservation world-wide. I have felt the need for a little BROWN to creep into my maintenance program. We have certain areas on the golf course here at Valley View that are prime spots to cut back on irrigation and conserve one of our precious resources. It has been tough for me, but those areas that are typically out-ofplay (I know I cannot say that for all of you (3) are ideal areas to cut back on irrigation and



mowing. Some of you may have noticed these areas, and some of you...probably not! These areas will become more extreme as I allow myself to cut back on even more irrigation. It helps for me to watch the British Open. Those golf courses are a perfect example of a water conservation program!!!

I hope you are all having a great 2023 golf season. Please fix your ball marks on the greens and PLEASE replace those MONSTER divots that we are finding in the fairways most mornings. Someone is not showing much respect to the golf course and to the other members. Please replace your divots...big or small.

Take care. It is almost FOOTBALL SEASON. I cannot wait!

We have just passed the mid-way point in Valley View's golf season. The month of July VVGC hosted The 4<sup>th</sup> of July Orange Ball, Men's Invitational, Ladies Swing for Hope Scramble, and the Iron Person events. July was a busy tournament month. Thanks goes out to all the staff members at Valley View for their devotion to hosting these fun events. We will not have events without the membership's participation. The membership's loyalty and feedback will only help the staff to continue to improve in our tournament operations.

The VVGC Club Championship will be held August 5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>h</sup>. This event is open to all VV Members. As for me writing this newsletter, we have four ladies signed up for the event, which is double from last season. It is hard to avoid conflicts and we know it conflicts with Riverside's Divots & Divas tournament. We would love to see this doubled each season.
