For as long as we can all remember the VVGC Pro Shop has been operated by a PGA Professional that is an independent contractor. We have learned that the vast majority of Clubs employ their PGA professional versus engaging in an independent contractor relationship. In discussions with our pro, Ted Babcock, he is open to either. When long time pro Scott Kremmel retired the Board entered a three-year contract with Ted and this is the last year of that contract. There were substantial changes made from Scott's contract to Ted's. Those changes will make the transition to Club ownership easier if that is the decision. The Board is weighing the pros and cons of the Club owning the Pro Shop and plans to decide in the coming months. If you have questions or thoughts, please feel free to share them with me or the Board members.

Valley View Golf Club is a non-profit 501(c)(7) social organization under the IRS code. As such we are exempt from income tax and with that benefit come federal regulations that must be followed. One of those regulations is limits on nonmember revenue. Therefore, it is important that we track income generated from nonmembers. If you bring a guest and you pay for their food and golf that is not considered nonmember revenue. On the other hand, if you bring them as a guest and they pay their own way it is considered nonmember revenue. Our servers are asked to know the members and we have members that don't frequent the Club that often, therefore it is difficult and takes a while. If you or your guest are asked whether you are a member, please do not take offense. Also, please PRINT your name on your charge slips.

## Course

There are benefits to opening the golf course in the first week of April. Dealing with frozen water coolers, frozen ball washers, layers of ice on the greens, and the wide variation of weather conditions in the last 4 weeks have NOT been one of those benefits. The sad part is that the month of May will probably be no different. Thanks to my staff for being flexible. Our current "targeted" start time of 7:00 a.m. has been about as consistent as the temperatures outside. I am ready for warm temperatures…please let the fun times begin.

The "driving range mat only" restrictions will continue for a bit longer. I know some of you are anxious to hit golf balls on the grass, but the turf is not at the point where we can turn the membership loose just yet. We installed a turf cover on the practice range tee for a couple weeks. This creates warm temperatures under the cover which stimulates growth. We have created some very nice green grass under the cover but now that we have removed the cover, we are relying on Mother Nature to take over and provide the warm temperatures to keep the grass growing...and that is the tricky part! We need the turf growing at a fast rate to heal the divots caused by many hours of members trying to hone their game!!! I am sure you are wondering why we do not leave the cover on for a couple more weeks. The temperatures created under the cover on a typical warm day can get too warm. To pull the cover back daily due to warm temperatures is



very labor intensive. We would need to shut the range down to remove the cover and then close the range again to install the cover. Weather related issues such as wind, rain, or snow make it impossible to move the cover at all. Also, the practice tee cannot be watered while the cover is in place. Once the turf has a good head start, we pull the cover and let Mother Nature take over. Please be patient...we will have you out on the grass as soon as possible.

I am not a huge fan of having to use golf cart signs out on the golf course. I would prefer to have no signs at all out on the course. There are times when signs are needed such as the "cart path only" signs on hole #6,7, and 12. These are temporary signs and will be removed once these fairways dry out. The signs I would like to permanently remove are the directional signs in front of the greens. I know we have many new members who do not know the golf course very well. But as a basic rule in golf...golfers should not be driving their golf cart up close to the greens. Be respectful to others and consider what kind of lie golfers would have to endure if we allowed golf cart traffic around the greens daily. If I were to remove the signs in front of #8 green, would members still refrain from driving cart through that area? I would hope so. If a member saw someone drive through this area, would they say something about this situation? I would hope so. I might experiment and pull these signs. I hope that this will be a successful experiment.

Another area that I would like to restrict golf cart access is the large group of willows on hole #5. This area stays soft all season and sometimes even produces standing water. The turf in this area is not very vigorous anyway due to the lack of sunshine so the less cart traffic in this area the better turf for golfers to enjoy. No cart traffic allowed EVER in this area would save maintenance from constantly having to install and remove signs, ropes, and stakes. Just a thought...actually a request from yours truly! Stay warm! See you on the golf course and...GO CATS!
