GOLF ON THE ROAD

Course Name | Location: Torrey Pines | LaJolla (San Diego), CA

Getting There: BZN to SD, short drive to LaJolla

Staying There: The Lodge at Torrey Pines, Hilton Torrey Pines. Both are on the course. Hilton is dated.

Review of Clubhouse and Ammenities: The clubhouse only consists of a retail store. Food at the Lodge at Torrey Pines is exceptional.

Review of Course: The south course is the played on tour every few years, and has more variety of hole layouts. The north course has more straight back-and-forth holes. Both courses were difficult but in excellent condition. Sharpen bunker play before going. Take plenty of extra golf balls.

Pros: Playing along the ocean is hard to beat.

Cons: Torrey Pines is a municipal course, so everything is bare bones. It is difficult to make a tee time, and very expensive. Small range and practice area. Expect a 5 hour round.

Go Again: No - there are tons of other courses on the ocean to try that are not as expensive or crowded.

Advice to Others: Stay on site and have your hotel make a tee time for you 90 days in advance. Be prepared for cooler ocean breezes and rain. Don't expect to have the premium overall eperience the price would lead you to believe you are getting.
