




FROM THE GENERAL MANAGER STEVE JOHNSON

We received 365 responses that will help guide the Board as they make decisions about improving your club. The results are to the right. The timing of the annual meeting was changed from the month of February to November at the last club election. This year's annual meeting is scheduled for Thursday, November 14, 2024. During the next few months, the Board will be reviewing the proposed 2025 budget and any potential ramifications on dues. In addition, there will be two 3-year term Board of Director positions available. Those positions are currently held by Len Roth and Lindsey Hurlburt. VVGC Bylaws state any stockholder may nominate a director, by delivering such nomination in writing to the Board of Directors or the General Manager at least 30 days prior to the annual meeting. 


