


# CRAIG T. JOHNSON

### FROM THE GENERAL MANAGER



I would like to take a moment to thank each of you, along with the many member volunteers, for helping us successfully host the MSGA State Mid-Amateur at Valley View. It was a great event for Montana Golf—showcasing our club, our membership, and our course—while also generating additional revenue for the club and still allowing for member play. Best of all, our own members brought home the hardware, which you'll read more about in Ted's update.

As you are aware, we recently completed our greens aeration, a vital step in maintaining the long-term health of our putting surfaces. Along with this, I want to stress the importance of repairing pitch marks. With an average of 180 rounds played each day, and each golfer making on average eight ball marks per round, that adds up to nearly 1,500 marks per day—or about 44,000 per month.

When repaired correctly, a ball mark recovers in about 24 hours. When left unrepaired, it can take weeks, leaving scars that affect playability, aesthetics, and increase the workload of our grounds crew. Repairing your marks is not only a matter of golf etiquette and respect for fellow players, it is also one of the easiest and most impactful ways to help preserve our course. PLEASE take a moment to repair your ball marks every time you play.

There are instructions on how to correctly repair ball marks through many videos available on YouTube.

I know I can count on each of you to do your part in maintaining our great course. I continue to feel very blessed to serve as your General Manager, and I strive each day to be just a little better in making Valley View the very best it can be.


The MSGA Mid-Amateur was not the only tournament conducted at VVGC in August. The VVGC Club Championship was conducted August 9-10. Congrats to two first time champions, Max Troutman and Kira Connell. The first VVGC Ladies Member Guest was played on Sunday, August 17th. Lindy Ward and her guest Taylor Erickson were crowned the Overall Champions.

VVGC will host high school events on September 11 and 18, with both competitions commencing at 10:00 a.m. via shotgun start. Tee-times will be available for general play beginning at 4:00 p.m. each day, contingent upon weather conditions. The sole member event in September is the inaugural VVGC Short Grass Scramble, scheduled for Sunday, September 21 at 10:00 a.m. Registration is currently open through Golf Genius, where participants can find details regarding the event format. True to its name, the tournament will feature a four-person scramble played from all tee boxes, focusing on fairway, fringe, and green cut grass. Teams unable to land their ball on the fairway or green must select the most advantageous shot; only the player responsible for that shot will take the subsequent stroke.

We sincerely appreciate your continued support of our golf club. We look forward to the successful final two months of our golf season.



Adding to my panic was the fact that we were to begin greens aerification the Monday after the tournament. I was at the point where I believed the golf course would never be green again! The temperatures were high during green aerification, and we drug sand on them until they were toasted in spots. The outlook was bleak and then my prayers were answered. The golf course received an inch of rain over a period of about three days. I was saved...or rather, my job was saved (I think). The golf course is on a slow path to recovery, but I feel much better today than I did on August 24-26th. I know the greens were not in the best health after the tournament and to subject them to an aerification in that condition was not the best scenario. I will try to plan better next time around. The greens will recover, maybe not as fast as in previous years. To pull a core from the greens always lengthens the recovery time, but this process is a necessary evil.

We will begin aerification on tees and fairways once I get my staff stabilized. With students back in school I will need to be on top of my game to keep priorities in check. I hope you all have had a great golf season here at Valley View. It has been stressful on my part due to all the new staff members and countless hours of training. Yes, we are still training, and it is now September! Hopefully, the pace will slow down, and we can all take a few deep breaths.

Early one morning I was gassing carts and I saw an eagle catch a fish in the lake.


Who's your dream golf foursome—famous or fictional? John Daly, Min Woo Lee, Winston Churchill
