
The final subject I would like to cover is taking care of our beautiful golf course. The MSU Lacrosse Team held an event on September 19th. There was a total of ninety-six players in the event. While I was out picking up their prize holes, I was interested in seeing how the course made it through the event. Since the event was a four-person scramble, I worried the fairways would have unrepaired divot clusters. I was happy and honestly surprised to not find any unrepaired divot clusters. The greens were also almost impeccable in terms of 2452 ball marks not repaired.

This topic has been noted due to frequent feedback regarding members not repairing divots or ball marks. When asked about the reasons for these repairs not being completed, a specific explanation is unavailable. The golf shop currently offers a new supply of ball mark repair tools. Each golf cart is equipped with two sand seed bottles. For those who walk, there are additional bottles available that can be attached to bags or push carts.

September has come and gone but how amazing was that weather for the membership here at Valley View. The maintenance staff even appreciated the temperatures. Better than working with three layers of clothing to protect you from the cold. The only downside is that the grass continues to grow! Dealing with smaller staff at this time of year we rely on the mowing portion of our job to slow down. We are now dealing with mowing grass AND the dreaded leaf chaos. This time of year, we are at the mercy of the leaves dropping to the ground. We cannot proceed with many daily maintenance tasks until we get the leaves herded somewhere so that they are not causing issues with the golfers or the maintenance staff. Dropping of the leaves can be such a long, drawn-out process. Most years we are dealing with leaves until snow permanently covers the golf course. This is especially frustrating provided the small window when we must spray fungicides. If we have a major snowstorm arriving, it can get very hectic trying to remove leaves and spray before snow arrives. Wind is the major factor. A full day of leaf removal can get wiped out in 5 minutes if the wind starts blowing. Ok...I need to change the subject...I feel my blood pressure beginning to rise just writing about these wonderful times.

As I am drafting this article we are receiving our first autumn snowfall. And yes...there are people out golfing through the snowflakes. It looks as though we are going to have our first MAJOR frost on October 6th. We have had a few frost delays in September but nothing that has delayed the golfers...just maintenance. Please have patience when we get into the long frost delays. We schedule first tee times according to past years. I know that there were people frustrated with scheduled tee times and the temperatures were unseasonably moderate. We are just trying to prevent having possibly 10-15 tee times being cancelled due to lengthy frost delays. I must admit it is no fun having to decide on holding back twenty or so golfers that have been hanging around the pro shop for an hour or more. And PLEASE...do not go out on the practice tee or green until you are given the go ahead. The east end of the range tee and practice green are always lagging when it comes to melting frost.

I will keep you posted on any hole closures that are necessary for fairway aerification. We are getting to that time of year where Mother Nature has a lot to say about what we can do as a maintenance staff. Hopefully, the weather will continue to cooperate with us, and the remainder of the golf season will go smoothly.

Friendly reminders for the membership...please fix 1828 ball marks. Those of you who do...thank you. Those of you who are not bothered by large ball marks on the greens...please make fixing ball marks part of your routine. This really does not take much effort...it does take having some respect for the other members and the golf course. Also please rake your tracks in the bunkers and leave the rakes INSIDE the bunkers. We do not mind raking bunkers that animals have played in, but golfers should once again...show some respect for others.

Hope you had a wonderful year here at Valley View Golf Club.




There is a lot going on "behind the scenes" from before sunrise to after sunset to make members' time at Valley View the most relaxing and enjoyable it can be.


